This study makes an important contribution to the field of heat transfer using hybrid nanofluid technology, which has the potential to improve the efficiency of cooling and energy systems.

Meanwhile, for the Best Journal Article category (Social Sciences and Humanities) – National Index, the second-place winner was secured by the article titled 'From Complexity to Clarity: A DEMATEL Analysis of Critical Blockchain Technology Adoption Factors' published in the Journal of Governance and Integrity (publication year 2024).



This article was produced by Associate Professor Ts Dr Lee Chia Kuang, a lecturer at the Faculty of Industrial Management (FPI), UMP SA, as the corresponding author, together with Marián Bujna (University of Agriculture, Slovakia) and Jankin Abdul Rahman (UMPSA).

This study uses the DEMATEL (Decision-Making Trial and Evaluation Laboratory) approach to analyse critical factors in blockchain technology adoption.

The award presentation ceremony was held on 9 December 2025 at Dewan Za'ba, Ministry of Higher Education, Putrajaya, and was officiated by the Deputy Director-General of Higher Education (Academic and Research), Department of Higher Education, MOHE, Professor Dr Zainal Amin Ayub.
