Universiti Malaysia Pahang (UMP) received 380 new students for the academic session of 2018/2019 through its campuses in Gambang and Pekan on January 25, 2019.

Out of the 380 students, 167 were those with diploma or of equivalent qualification and would be pursuing tertiary education.
