UMP Holdings and Yayasan UMP help affected communities

KUANTAN, 19 January 2021 - Sympathise with those affected by the floods, many parties extended assistance by donating various necessities for the flood victims in Pahang.

Recently, the UMP Prihatin Squad from Yayasan UMP and UMP Holdings presented donations to

more than 300 communities affected by the flood around Sungai Lembing, Panching and Paya Besar.

Also present were Paya Besar Member of Parliament, Yang Berhormat Mohd Shahar Abdullah who is also the Deputy Minister of Finance II, Chief Executive Officer of UMP Holdings and Groups, Ir. Dr. Syed Mohamad Hamzah Al-Junid Syed Abdul Rahman and the Head of the Office of the Vice-Chancellor, Zainuddin Mat Hussin.
