## 45 UMP-BJTU JPA-sponsored students depart for China



SEPANG, 13 February 2023 - A total of 45 students of the Dual Degree Programme of Universiti Malaysia Pahang (UMP) and Beijing Jiaotong University (BJTU) China departed to China recently to continue their studies for two years there.

The engineering students in developing the country's rail industry are pioneer students of the dual degree collaboration programme who will continue their studies at a leading university in Beijing after two and a half years of study at UMP.

The Semester 1 study session in China begins in February each year.

Of the 45 students, ten are in the Electrical and Electronic Engineering programme, 20 in Mechanical Engineering and 15 in Civil Engineering at BJTU.



According to the UMP Vice-Chancellor, Professor Dato' Ts. Dr. Yuserrie, the growth of the manufacturing and industrial sectors in Malaysia today requires more experts and skills in various fields of technology.

"Technical and Vocational Education Training (TVET) is also seen to surge the country's education system.

"UMP also appreciates the support of the Public Service Department (JPA) and Chinese Ambassador in Malaysia who contributed RMB100,000.00 or RM65,000 to UMP students via collaboration with universities from China.


