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Profesor Turun Padang Programme: Merdeka Scavenger Hunt fosters spirit of love of country and English through gamification

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PEKAN, 18 September 2024 - In conjunction with the initiative of Profesor Turun Padang at Universiti

Malaysia Pahang Al-Sultan Abdullah (UMPSA), the Centre for Modern Languages (PBM) in collaboration with MELTA Pahang Chapter (MPC) and Persatuan Matahari organised the Merdeka Scavenger Hunt programme held at the Pekan and Gambang campuses on 18 and 19 September 2024.

“The competencies and abilities available at the university can be shared in a fun and more comprehensive way.

“In addition to having the opportunity to study with university professionals, my son’s participation this time is more meaningful as his school holidays are more beneficial.

“My son gets to meet new friends and try to do fun activities,” she said.
