Professor Dato' Dr. Daing Nasir said the institute would play an important role in helping to enhance one-way cultural exchange between the two countries.

"In fact, we have already established good ties with Hebei University since 2011 and that there are 22 Mandarin Language and Culture Centre students from Hebei University in Malaysia."

Hebei University, a university in China, has been appointed by Hanban to work on establishing collaboration with UMP.

To date, there are two institutes of higher learning in Malaysia that have set up Confucius Institute - Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM) and Universiti
