# **107 pupils received school supplies donated by UMP Alumni and NGOs**

The 'Back to School 2019' Pilgrimage Program was held on December 22, 2019, and is an annual program jointly organized by the UMP Graduate Alumni Association (UMP Alumni), the Malaysian

The program aims to help the asnaf zakat, poor and Muslim converts (Mualaf) prepare for the 2020 school session.

"The contribution raised was RM 20, 472.00 from the public and outside sponsors.
