**UMP is now known as UMPSA**



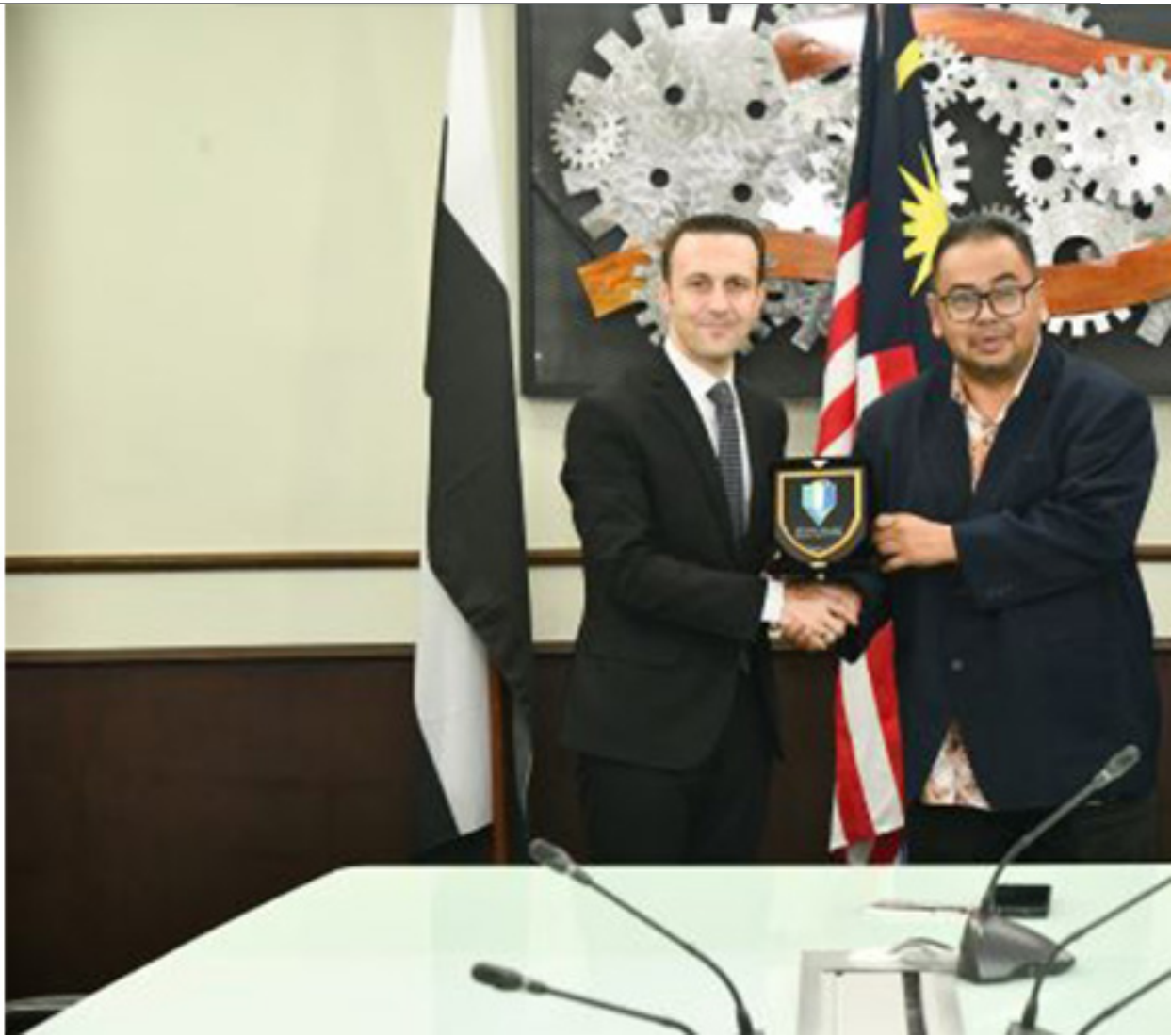
