**UMP is now known as UMPSA**



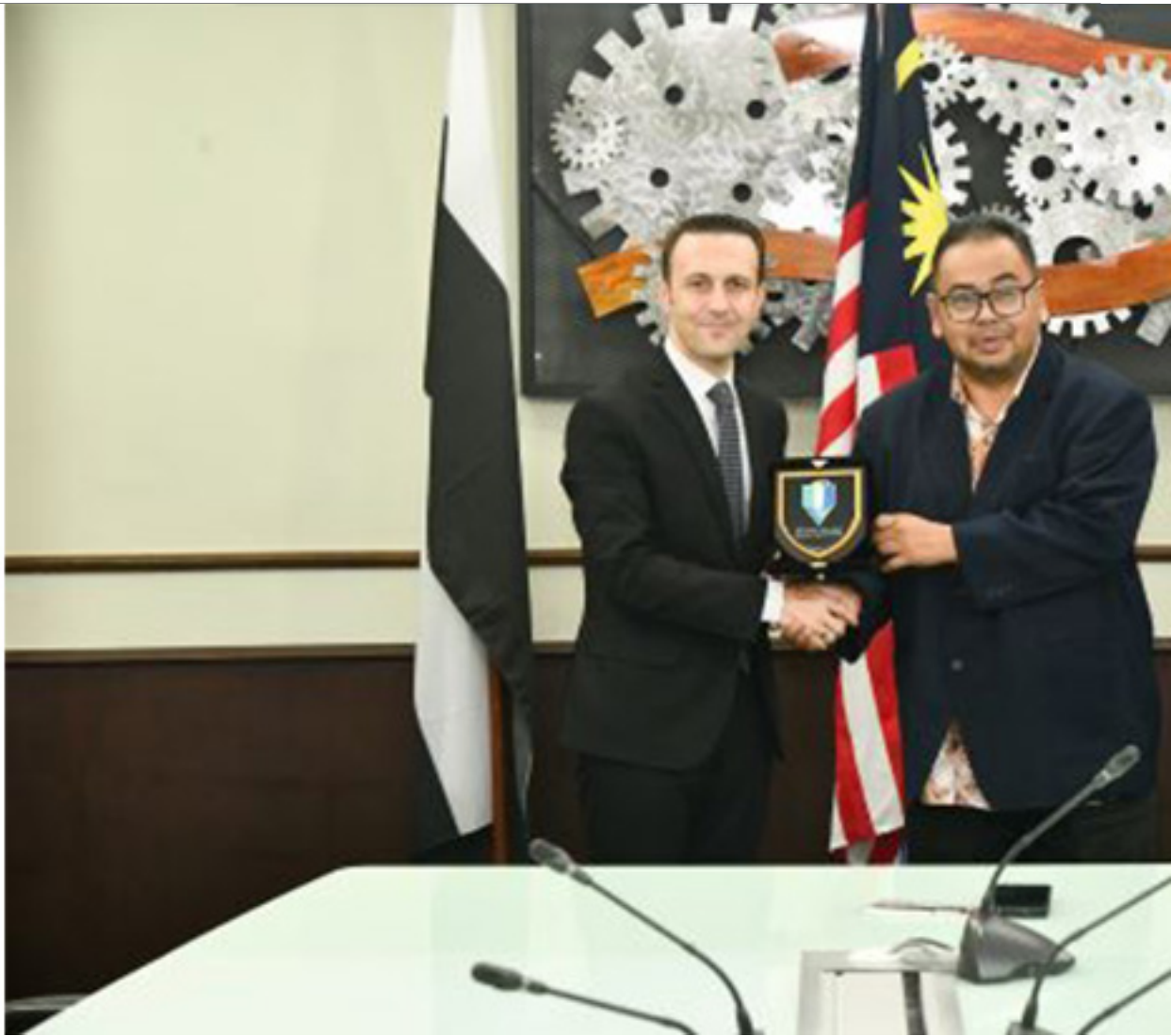
After 21 years of glory, Universiti Malaysia Pahang (UMP) is now branded as Universiti Malaysia Pahang Yang Maha Mulia Seri Paduka Baginda Yang di-Pertuan Agong Al-Sultan Abdullah Ri'ayatuddin Al-Mustafa Ahmad Shah Al-Musta'in Billah consented to the use of the UMPSA logo and name according to the Federal Order in Council 2023.

The university started as the University College of Engineering and Technology Malaysia (KUKTEM), a technical university established in 2002. After five years of operation, the Government of Malaysia announced the change of the name KUKTEM to Universiti Malaysia Pahang effective 1 February 2007.

According to the UMPSA Vice-Chancellor, Professor Dato' Ts. Dr. Yuserrie Zainuddin, the university's branding success coincides with its vision towards a leading technological university.
