UMPSA supports STEM-encouraged school students in Tuaran

TUARAN, 1 March 2024 - The management of Universiti Malaysia Pahang Al-Sultan Abdullah (UMPSA) provided support to school students and encouraged STEM learning involving Kampung Kiwatu, Kampung Batangan, Kampung Roun, and Kampung Serusop and surrounding areas of Tuaran, targeting efforts to inspire young people and B40 students.

This programme is part of the activities carried out under the *'Program Kembara* <u>Prihatin@Negeri</u> *di bawah Bayu 2.0'* involving 60 UMPSA Kilau volunteers from the UMPSA Foundation Squad together with collaborating partners, namely Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS), Yayasan Sabah College of Technology (KTYS), and Kota Kinabalu Polytechnic.

It aims to provide support to the community in Tuaran through programmes related to technology, education, and the community.

In the meantime, participants also had the opportunity to stay with their foster families to strengthen relationships with residents of Kampung Batangan, Kiwatu, Roun, Serusup, Selupoh, Dungang Baru, and Labuaya.
