# 83 UMPA Doctor of Philosophy graduates celebrated this year

GAMBANG, 25 October 2024 – A total of 83 Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) graduates from Universiti Malaysia Pahang Al-Sultan Abdullah (UMPSA) were honoured during the 19th UMPA Convocation Ceremony this year.

The graduates were celebrated in a Hooding Ceremony for PhD Graduates 2024, organised by the

Institute of Graduate Studies (IGS). Among them, 53 are local graduates, while the remaining 30 are international graduates from various countries.

The ceremony was held as a tribute to the graduates for overcoming the challenges and hardships of pursuing a doctoral degree.
