# Engines roar at UMPSA as over 120 luxury and antique vehicles roll in

GAMBANG, 27 July 2025 – The usually quiet Chancellery Grounds at Universiti Malaysia Pahang Al-Sultan Abdullah (UMPSA) roared to life today as more than 100 gleaming luxury and vintage cars, along with 20 high-powered motorcycles, arrived in style for the Friendly Reception and Luxury & Antique Car Gathering (*Majlis Ramah Mesra dan Perhimpunan Kereta Mewah dan Antik*), held in conjunction with the Kuantan Festival 188.
